Join us for a lively examination of the challenges and pitfalls of discussing religion in the public school classroom. A reception will follow.

The evening will open with the Washington, D.C., premiere of “In God We Teach,” a documentary by Vic Losick that tells the story of the conflict that erupts in a New Jersey community after a student secretly records his history teacher’s professions of faith.

Following the film, Emile Lester will offer a “democratic approach” to inclusion of religion in the curriculum drawn from his provocative new book Teaching about Religions.
